

NAPLES AUTO DONATION CENTER DONATES \$35,000 TO SUPPORT FOSTER CHILDREN

Naples, FL (May 2, 2022) Friends of Foster Children Forever announced Naples Auto Donation Center (NADC) donated \$35,000 from this year's car sales to help foster children. The donation will support the tutoring program for children in Collier, Hendry and Glades counties.

NADC accepts auto donations to help local abused and neglected children. This is never a cost to the donor. NADC will pick up, make minor repairs, detail, and sell the donated vehicle as well as facilitate all paperwork, titles, and IRS Form 1098-C for the tax deduction.

"Naples Auto Donation Center was founded in 2011 with co-founder Bill Walsh to support the Academic Mentoring Program of Friends of Foster Children Forever," said Doug Campbell, NADC Board Chair. "Even though Bill died unexpectedly at age 58, we are proud to honor his legacy by continuing in our shared vision to benefit programs for children in need through the help of generous car donors."

"When individuals have a car they no longer need or want, NADC is a wonderful option," said Ann Hughes, executive director for Friends of Foster Children Forever. Their donations help a significant amount of foster children. We are honored that NADC has chosen us as one of their recipients."

Since inception, NADC has donated over \$225,000 to Friends of Foster Children Forever resulting in over 6,500 hours of tutoring for foster children so they do not fall behind in school.
